DIRECTOR'S NOTE by RILEY GENE

Let's celebrate the vibrant spectrum of gender non-conformity by casting aside harmful stereotypes and rejecting damaging anti-trans narratives. In today's media, queer individuals have often been depicted through a lens of deep tragedy and overwhelming trauma. While it's important to acknowledge these sides as valid parts of a growing-up tale, our focus here shifts to the uncontainable joy of embracing your true self.

Initially conceived by the playwright to shed light on the plight of women's subjugation, the original production intriguingly assembles an all cis-male ensemble, except for one female actor. Yikes. In this reimagined rendition of Peter and the Starcatcher, we delve deeper into the realm of gender expression, artfully traversing the terrain of queer self-discovery. This exploration entwines the exuberance of youth, the trials of solitude, and the profound metamorphosis that unfolds upon embracing one's authentic self.

The text itself, surprisingly, provides much of the groundwork for this narrative, offering a seamless path forward. The essence of the story is inherently suited to this transformation, ensuring a journey that resonates authentically with the themes we aim to illuminate.

LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Theatre Off Jackson acknowledges that we are operating on the ancestral lands of the Duwamish people who are the original stewards of this land and continue to live here today. We honor the work of Indigenous artists in our community and understand how important Indigenous art is to the future of this land. The Duwamish people have an oral history that stretches back to the last Ice Age. Their ancestral lands encompass the Seattle/Greater King County area, and they have given care and Lushshootseed names to the geography that surrounds us today. An acknowledgement like this is nowhere near enough to heal a history of colonization and the unkept promises made in The Treaty of Point Elliot in 1855, but it is a start to better align ourselves with Indigenous communities and grow to become stronger advocates for Indigenous rights. Today, the Duwamish still host events and meet at the Duwamish Longhouse located in what we call West Seattle. The Duwamish are continuously fighting to become a federally recognized tribe and you can stand with them by writing a letter of support to your local, state, and federal representatives using the resources from the Duwamish Tribe website. www.duwamishtribe.org
